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Carol Mostow LICSW has spent 21 years training physicians and other health professionals specializing in relational skills in patient care, teamwork and teaching; the use of self in medicine; and provider well-being. Carol serves as faculty for AACH national and regional courses and is a rounds facilitator at 2 hospitals for the Schwartz Center for Compassionate Healthcare.

At Boston Medical Center, she has worked closely with Boston University residents and faculty as the Associate Director of Psychosocial Training in first the Department of Medicine and now the Department of Family Medicine where she is an Assistant Professor. In 2001, Carol founded a Diversity Curriculum Task Force with BMC physician colleagues to identify the skill set they used to connect effectively with patients whose backgrounds differed greatly from their own. She was the principal investigator in a faculty development project piloting precepting methods to transmit these skills to trainees and is the lead author of an article describing that work titled Treating and Precepting with RESPECT: a Relational Model Addressing Race, Culture and Ethnicity in Medical Training published in the May 2010 JGIM supplement on Healthcare Disparities Education. Carol also brings to her work 25 years as a therapist in a variety of settings.
