

Mark R. Marcantano President and COO Women & Infants Hospital of Rhode Island



In April 2014, Marcantano was named president and chief operating officer (COO) of Women & Infants Hospital, in Providence. The hospital is the primary teaching affiliate of The Warren Alpert Medical School of Brown University for obstetrics, gynecology, and newborn pediatrics. He previously served as the hospital's executive vice president and COO since January 2010.

Marcantano came to Women & Infants from Boston Children's Hospital, where he served as vice president of ambulatory and network services. In this capacity, he was responsible for operations, budgeting, financial performance, business

planning, and facility planning for ambulatory services on the hospital's main campus, as well as nine other network locations and a community health center, which recorded 55,000 visits annually.

Before his position at Children's Hospital, Marcantano was executive dean, senior vice president, and chief operating officer of Albany Medical College, affiliated with Albany Medical Center, in New York. He was instrumental in recruiting new researchers, shepherding the renovation of facilities, and transforming traditional academic departments into entrepreneurial centers of excellence.

Marcantano earned a bachelor of science degree in finance from New York University and went on to earn his juris doctor from Albany Law School of Union University, in Albany, N.Y. He currently serves as a member of the board of Meeting Street.
