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After finishing residency at University of New Mexico, Albuquerque, in 1999, I have done additional training at Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in Artificial Intelligence as part of their Executive MBA program. In my current role as chair of the Department of Community Health and Family Medicine (CHFM), and Chair of the Division of Telemedicine, I oversee 116 physicians and providers in an academic setting, and help improve access via virtual visits of a diverse set of primary care patients in an outpatient setting. I directly supervise their clinical duties, allocate their teaching responsibilities, and encourage scholarly activity. I also have a multimillion dollar, 3-year program development grant from the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) to implement telemedicine for patients living with HIV.
