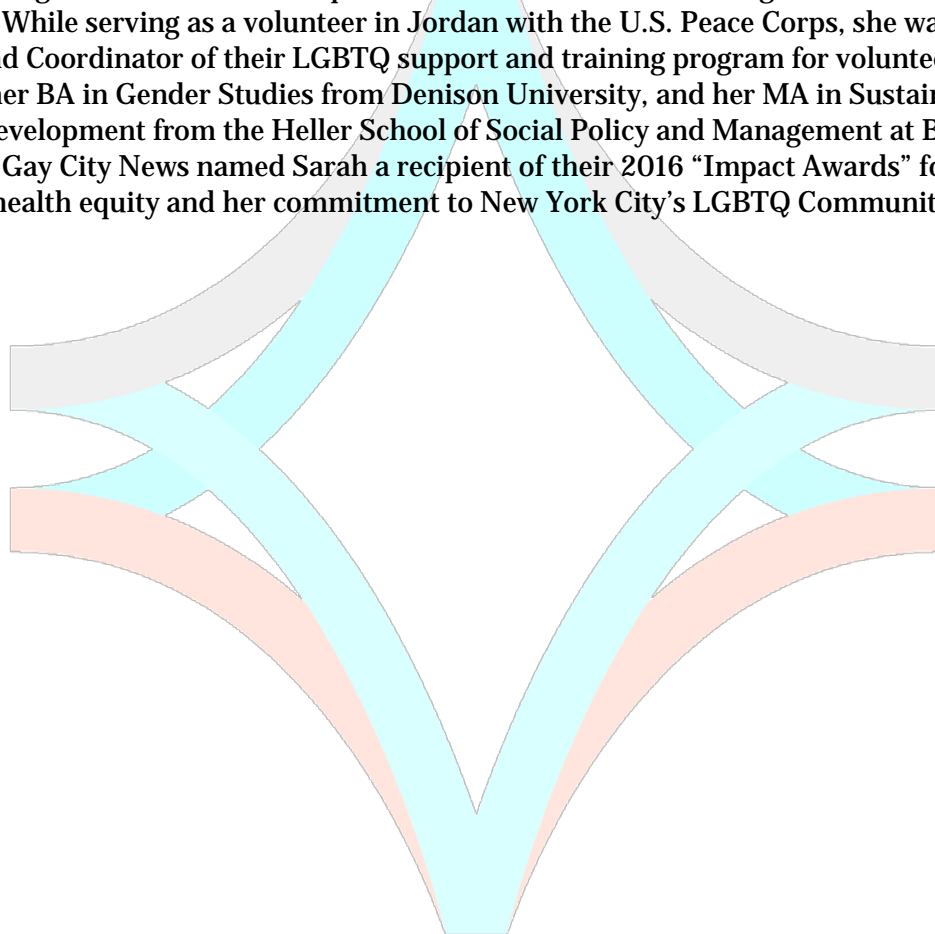


Sarah Bender, MA

Sarah Bender is currently the Associate Director of Gender Equity at NYC Health + Hospitals' Office of Diversity and Inclusion. Sarah has been leading the growth of LGBTQ affirming healthcare services at NYC Health + Hospitals since 2014, when she joined the team at NYC Health + Hospitals/Metropolitan to spearhead the Health System's pioneer LGBTQ health equity program, the Pride Health Center. Sarah has always focused on the intersections of gender and sexuality with social issues like health, human rights, and public policy; she previously taught courses on these topics for the Transitional Year Program at Brandeis University. While serving as a volunteer in Jordan with the U.S. Peace Corps, she was the Founder and Coordinator of their LGBTQ support and training program for volunteers and staff. Sarah has her BA in Gender Studies from Denison University, and her MA in Sustainable Program Development from the Heller School of Social Policy and Management at Brandeis University. Gay City News named Sarah a recipient of their 2016 "Impact Awards" for her work in LGBTQ health equity and her commitment to New York City's LGBTQ Communities.



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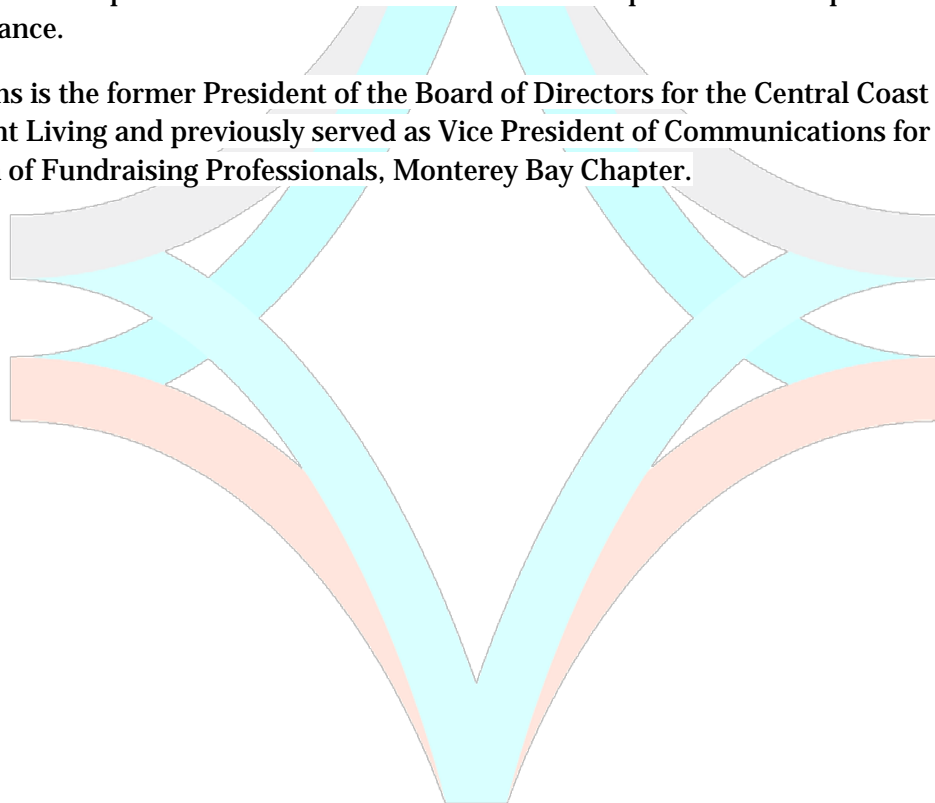

Ms. Williams also has extensive experience in nonprofit management and governance.

Ms. Williams is the former President of the Board of Directors for the Central Coast Center for Independent Living and previously served as Vice President of Communications for the Association of Fundraising Professionals, Monterey Bay Chapter.

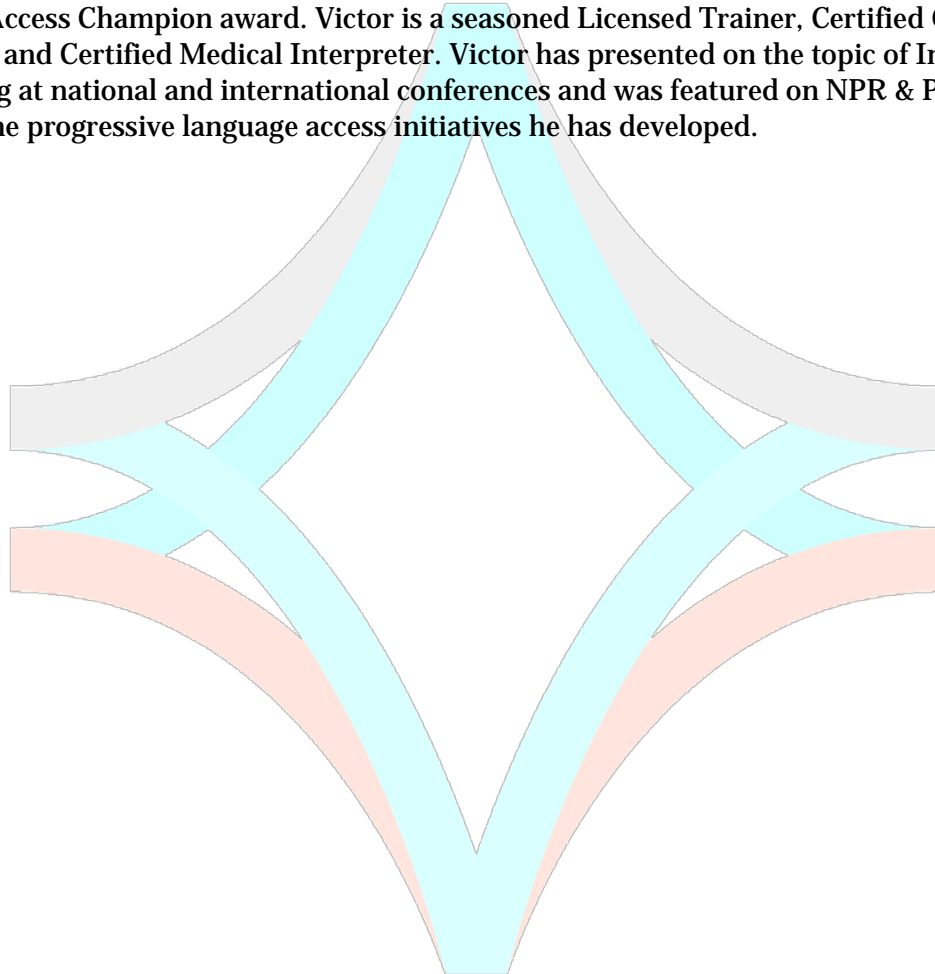


Victor Sosa
